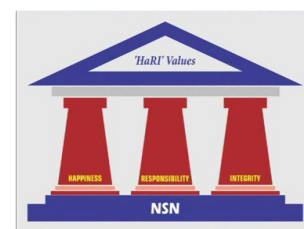

### **CORRESPONDENT'S GROWTH SESSION FOR THE STUDENTS OF STD XI & XII**

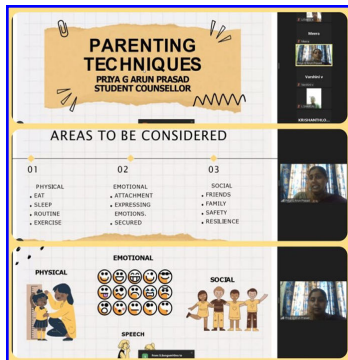
## CLUB DAY 2 FOR STD VI-IX- 12.8.'23

## SESSION ON PARENTING TECHNIQUES - 5.8.'23

A virtual session on 'Parenting' for parents of primary students was held on 5.8.'23, at the NSN Group of Schools by the Student Counsellor. The focus was to give the parents clarity on parenting techniques. The behaviour modification of children, through reward and punishment, was discussed. The parents were advised to be specific about the behaviour for which the child is rewarded, to avoid confusion. They were also alerted to avoid excessive material rewards, which may lead to entitlement or dependence on external validation. It was an interactive session, and the parents shared many instances of child behaviour which called for reward and punishment.



### **SESSION ON SUBSTANCE ABUSE-1.8.'23 to 8.8.'23**

A session on Substance Abuse was conducted by our Student Counsellors, for the students of Std IX - XII from 1.8.'23 to 8.8.'23. The session's main focus was to create awareness, and educate the students about the ill-effects of alcoholism and substance abuse, on the individual, family, school environment, work-place, and the society at large. They were educated on the stages and types of addiction, factors contributing to it, the three effects of drug abuse, and the ways to prevent substance addiction. The students were enlightened on how they can prevent themselves from falling prey to this destructive habit, where to seek help from, and most importantly that drugs are not a meaningful solution to the challenging situations they may face in life.



### **DESIGN THINKING- 9.8.'23**

In order to gain knowledge on the problem solving skill, a session on Design Thinking was held for the students of Std IX on 09.08.'23. The resource person was Mr. Rishidev, the CEO of CONIOT and ONDRU. The session started with an introduction to design thinking, and the areas it is used in, like learning, entertainment, sports etc. The meaning of precision and accuracy, and how design thinking helps to make precision, and accuracy high, was clearly explained with examples. The facilitator gave a clear picture of the following:

- What Design thinking is.
- Process of Design thinking.
- When do you Design think?
- How does the Design thinking process work?

The session was very interactive and informative, where the students gained knowledge on its efficient use.



## **HANDWRITING CONTEST- STD. I TO VIII - 10.8.'23**

A good handwriting improves the self-confidence, and also contributes to reading fluency, as it activates the visual perception of letters. A Handwriting Contest was conducted for the students of Std. I to VIII on 10<sup>th</sup> August, 2023. The objective of this competition was to encourage students to improve



their handwriting skills, fine motor skills, and confidence. It provides students with an opportunity to display their competency in legible writing. The response of the students was encouraging. Many of the students put in their best efforts to enhance their writing skills.

## **A VISIT TO THE BANK BY COMMERCE STUDENTS**

In order to facilitate an immersive learning experience for the Commerce students of Std XI and XII, they were taken to the Indian Bank on 10.8.'23, 11.8.'23, 29.8.'23 and 30.8.'23. The objective of the visit was to provide students with an exposure on how a bank actually works. Students learnt about the role of treasury, the cheque transactions, the growing technology of UPI, and its counterpart, the role of bank in demonetization, the types of loans and the processes involved, the importance of knowledge about economy, and the so-called cyber-crime. They were shown the specimens of different challans used for cash deposits, withdrawal of money, opening an a/c, registering for net banking, request for cheque leaves, and so on. The students found the visit very useful and informative.

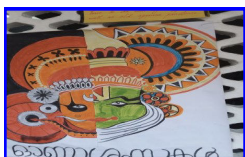
### **ONAM SPECIAL ASSEMBLY: (VI - VIII) - 28.8.'23**
