

er data on students' snack choices: healthy options, junk food, and snacks aligned with school guidelines..




SESSION BY STAFF NURSE FOR STD IX - XII


DEAR TIME

WORKSHOP ON LESSON PLAN AND BIG IDEAS


Additionally, he demonstrated how to register and log in to the teacher's portal, which assists teachers in preparing lesson plans, worksheets, and question papers.


STEM LAB ORIENTATION FOR THE MENTORS OF STD VI TO VIII

tors, and preventive measures through lifestyle changes.


Remedies and treatments were explained, and preventive exercises were demonstrated, empowering staff with knowledge to manage and prevent varicose veins effectively.

SPECIAL EDUCATOR'S SESSION ON CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT



Mrs. Gayathri also demonstrated the platform's ability to categorize students and assign questions based on difficulty levels. The interactive and informative session generated significant interest among teachers, in utilizing the platform's activities and tools.


INTRAMURALS - ATHLETICS FOR JUNIOR BOYS

ways to enhance it, and clarified the counsellor's role in






